### AVIATION EXPERIENCE

Students of Thushara High School had an unforgettable and enriching aviation experience during their educational visit to Mamnoor Airport on 22 November 2025.

The visit gave the students a rare opportunity to witness the flying of a microlight training aircraft from a very close distance, filling them with excitement, curiosity, and awe.

The trip was carefully organized by Maj. V. Narender, Principal of the Thushara High School, in coordination with the Commanding Officer, 4(A) T Battalion, NCC, Warangal. With the kind permission of



Wing Commander Ashish Bhaskar, the students were warmly welcomed at the airport.

His enthusiasm and passion for aviation instantly captured

the attention of the students and made the learning experience lively and inspiring.

As the microlight aircraft performed multiple take-offs and landings, students watched in amazement, thrilled by the roar of the engine and the precision of the pilot. Many students expressed their excitement as they felt the power of the aircraft and observed how various factors such as wind, speed, and



runway conditions influence flight. The live demonstrations sparked numerous questions and discussions among the students, reflecting their growing interest in aviation.

The NCC cadets and staff present at the airport patiently explained the detailed working mechanism of the aircraft, including the various controls and instruments used during flight. Students listened attentively, eager to understand how an aircraft responds to pilot commands. This interaction helped them connect theoretical knowledge with real-world applications.

A major highlight of the visit was the demonstration of the flight simulator by the Commanding Officer. The simulator, designed like an actual cockpit and controlled by a computer, provided a realistic flying experience. Students were fascinated to learn how trainee pilots practice repeatedly in different weather conditions, airflow situations, and day-and-night scenarios before flying real aircraft. They appreciated how the simulator



helps build confidence and reduces fear among beginner pilots.

A few lucky Thusharians even got the opportunity to experience simulator flying under expert guidance. Their joy and excitement were evident as they shared their experiences with their friends, describing the thrill of controlling an aircraft and feeling like real pilots for a moment.

The visit lasted for more than three hours, yet the students remained fully engaged throughout. As the day came to an end, students expressed immense happiness and gratitude for such a rare opportunity. Many shared that the visit inspired them to dream big and consider careers in aviation, defence services, and aerospace engineering. 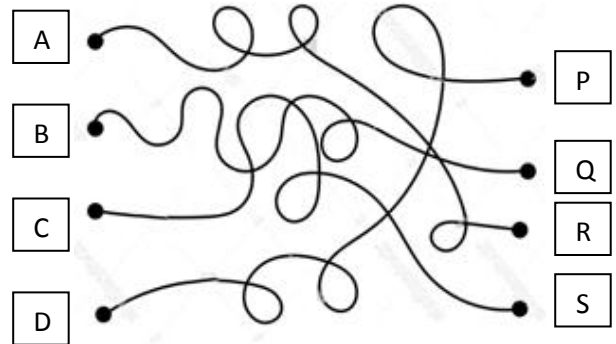
