Industrial visit that ignited the Entrepreneurial thinking!

Thushara Desk: On 23rd August 2025, the students of Thushara High School had the opportunity to visit the nearby industrial area as part of their educational activity. They explored three different industries—an Aluminium Factory, a Book Binding Unit, and an Apparel Factory—to gain practical knowledge about industrial processes.

In the Aluminium Factory, the students observed how Aluminium is processed step by step. They witnessed the melting of the metal, its molding into blocks, the conversion of these blocks into sheets, and finally how these sheets are shaped into useful vessels. The live demonstration gave them a clear understanding of the transformation of raw material into finished products.

The visits to the Book binding unit and Apparel Factory further enriched their knowledge of how everyday products are made and prepared for consumers. This exposure to real-time industrial activities was highly informative and motivating for the students.

The visit left a lasting impression, motivating the students to appreciate both industrial progress and the human effort behind it.

Students' Reflections on the Industrial Visit:

I got an opportunity to visit three industries as part of our "Thushara Industrial Tour" on 23rd August, 2025. We started from our school by a bus at 9.30am and reached the Industrial Area, Warangal by 10.00am. The first industry we entered was an Aluminium factory. The first point was a room with big furnace that generates high

temperature enough to melt all kinds of Aluminium products which were collected as scrap and raw material. The molten liquid was then put in to the moulds so that a thick block of the sheet was formed.

The room was so hot that we could not spend even five minutes. But, the workers need to work there for 8 hours. Then I realised the real time working environment. The next stage was to press the Aluminium blocks and convert them in to sheets of different gauges. I found nearly 30 employees were doing a very hard work at each level in the making of vessels.

The visit of apparel factory was bit fascinating as we see a variety of designs during shopping and wonder who make them and how? This visit cleared all my doubts.

We were very much surprised to see a variety of machines which are doing the cutting, stitching, emblem makers with embroidery; we tried to interact with some workers and came to know they will be working in 8 hour shifts.

The last industry we visited was the note book makers. This month was not actually a season for them and only few were found working. We have seen papers being counted and a set of papers were bundled along with a cover sheet and stapled together. Later all books were neatly cut to the exact size using a cutting machine.

I have seen hard work everywhere in spite the heavy machines being used. Then I tried imagining the life when there was no machinery. I came out with mixed feelings of observing the best products coming out and also a tough life behind them.

tickets, moving to the billing counters, and settling down in their allotted seats with discipline.

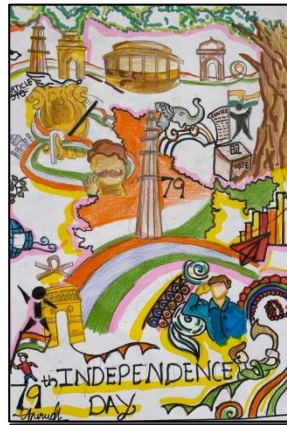
